If you are hesitant to change your veterinary practice management software, you're not alone. Many veterinary practice managers and owners have reservations about upgrading, but these fears can often be allayed.

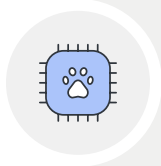
Reservations you may have about switching your veterinary software may include the following:

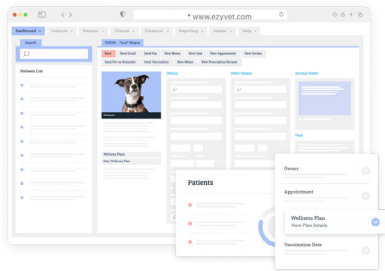

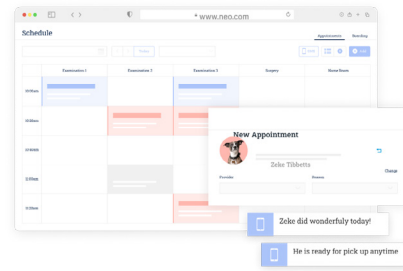
